## Thank you for Helping us Keep Bardfield Tidy

Thank you to everyone who joined our village clean-up on Saturday, April 5<sup>th</sup>. Twenty volunteers of all ages donned hi-vis jackets, picked up litter, trimmed overhanging brambles, and weeded overgrown areas in various parts of the village. Several rubbish bags were collected for disposal by Braintree District Council, especially from the village entrances where many beer cans, bottles, and takeaway boxes were found. We appreciate the community's efforts to keep our village tidy. More activities are planned

## **Planning Applications**

Coote House, Brook Street – single storey extensions and new porch

No objections provided the materials and design of the proposed extensions and porch meet the requirements of the Historic Buildings Officer and BDC planners for a property in the Conservation Area.

- Springfield House, Braintree Road demolition and rebuild. Despite revised plans the Parish Council continue to have concerns over the design and materials proposed. However, if these new plans now meet the planning officers' approval, we would not object provided that every effort is made to use appropriate quality materials to ensure that the building sits comfortably in its rural setting.
- Houlkers, Beslyns Road single and two storey extension, wall cladding and replacement roof No objections provided the materials and design of the proposed extensions meet the requirements of the Historic Buildings Officer and BDC planners for a property in the Conservation Area.

#### **Tree Works**

The Beeches, Braintree Road – no objection to tree works requested at this location.

#### **Call for Sites (Local Plan Review)**

The PC were recently notified of an additional area of land that had been put forward for development as part of Braintree District Council (BDC)'s review of their Local Plan. This site is the Glebe Meadow, which sits to the north of The Vicarage, Braintree Road, and currently provides a clear view of the Parish Church from the centre of the village and the village greens. This proposal was considered an entirely inappropriate use of this significant site, and a strong objection will be lodged.



This site is one of 3 parcels of land within Great Bardfield parish that have been submitted by their respective landowners as potential development sites. Under the 'Call for Sites', BDC will review these locations to decide whether they may be accepted. The Parish Council recognise that BDC are required to meet their housing targets, however, we have objected to each of these sites as inappropriate locations for new development. Local residents may also lodge their comments with BDC Planning department.

We do not yet know when these sites will come before the BDC planning committee for a decision. We have asked to be kept informed and hope to be able to attend.

#### **Footpaths**

Following receipt of a 'Proposed Stopping Up Order' from the Department of Transport relating to land off Bell Lane, adjacent to Bell Cottage, the Parish Council have undertaken site visits and discussions to ensure that this order does not impact on the existing footpath that leads from Bell Lane to the Vine and does not compromise the allotments. A response to this effect has been submitted to the Department of Transport.

Any residents that wish to make a response to this order should send their comments to nationalcasework@dft.gov.uk, with the reference: Proposed stopping up order, Moomin House, Bell Lane, OS Grid ref. E56392 N230584.

#### **Allotments**

The Parish Council agreed to donate a number of raised beds to the Village Allotments. These had been made for the proposed improvements to the Quiet Space which cannot now go ahead in its planned form, due to the increased marshiness of this site. We believe this to be due to underground springs,



# **GREENFINGERS**

#### **Gourmet's Paradise**

et me begin with the not-so gourmet, a possible cure for blackspot on roses: 2 parts water with 1 part milk and spray. Blight on Box: coat with sour milk. I am prepared to try the success of the first but the second! Stomach turning?

Now for the more appetising starter. First pick some wild garlic to scatter over grilled goat's cheese. Main course gives a choice from the garden, aforesaid wild garlic in a stir fry. Or, salivating at the thought of dill and cucumber in a vinaigrette over your grilled white fish. The garlic plant is invasive in a garden but acceptable in a woodland however, planting under a hedge, restricts its spread and you can enjoy lovely white flowers in late spring. Moving on to dessert, take a large meringue and decorate the cream and raspberries with edibles, violas and the large pink petunias (see April's *BT* article). Are you asking what gave rise to this cooking subject? Why, it is the promoting of veg patch to 'potager' status, but how?

## **Create a potager**

The potager is possible in a small area. Pass under the rose, clematis, honeysuckle arch into a growing area. Make it neat with a couple of raised beds, 4 wooden gravel boards, will make a bed 6ft by 4ft. Make it accessible with a brick or scaffold board path. Plant alpine strawberries to smother weeds along the soil abutting the bed. Now for easy seeds to sow. Tagetes, orange flowers, they deter unwanted insects on your veg plants. Better still, a dwarf hedge of dill, fronds for leaves with an attractive aniseed smell plus pale yellow flowers. A must have. Prefer the strawberries? Then dill and coriander grow well in pots. Dreamlike but attainable with the minimum effort.

# **Jobs in May**

- 1. Spray roses with my favourite and organic, Uncle Tom, or be brave and try the milk recipe but scatter rose feed around the base of the plants.
- 2. Plant out sweet peas if you haven't already. Support with twiggy sticks, Birch is good, metal obelisks better but costly.
- 3. Tender summer plants need to stand outside against the house wall for a week to get used to the outdoors. Then plant away particularly into pots to burst with summer flowers.



# **The Tuesday Club**

When a late change to our April speaker, as Amanda Sutherland was unable to be with us. She will be visiting us for her scheduled talk later in the summer, and two officers from Essex Fire & Rescue Service stepped in at short notice and gave an interesting talk about safety on the road and around water. There was an opportunity for interaction with a video where we were sitting in the driver seat and after a short time were asked if we had noticed things happening on the pavement or at junctions. At the end there was an opportunity to wear a virtual reality headset and experience aspects of driving in an emergency situation.

They also asked if we knew anyone over the age of 70 who had passed their driving test some years ago, but perhaps hadn't driven for some time and had lost confidence, or perhaps someone who felt that their journeys were restricted because they had never driven on a motorway or didn't feel confident when faced with large roundabouts. Anyone living in Essex can access a free "Driving with Confidence" course, during which the instructor comes to their home and accompanies them in their own car, giving advice and feedback on the issues they have raised. For more information visit www. saferessexroads.org, look at the Driving with Confidence option, where they will be able to download a form or use the telephone number provided.

Another tip, for those who haven't already done it, is to download the free "what3words" app. If you are ever in a situation where you need emergency help, this app will pinpoint your location to within a few yards, which the emergency services find very useful. And as someone said, it's useful for finding a friend who has wandered off during a shopping trip!

In May we shall be welcoming back a popular speaker, Brian Carline, who will be giving us "An Amusing Account of Life in Schools". After 35 years teaching in Essex schools he will have some tales to tell!

We welcome all to our meetings. Membership for the year costs only £25, but if you prefer to just come along to a talk which appeals to you we would love to see you on that occasion, visitors pay £5 including refreshments. There will be posters around the village each month. Doors open at 2.00 and the meetings start at 2.30.

# From the Vicarage...

ne of the significant moments of this month will be the 80th anniversary commemorations of VE Day, which will be observed through a number of events across our villages. No doubt, we will around that time see many clips from VE Day itself, with the waving flags and smiling faces depicted in the black and white film of the time. It's perhaps worth taking a moment to consider what it was that people were celebrating. On the one hand, the answer may seem obvious – who would not want to celebrate the ending of (at least part of) a war? But the challenges of war did not go away overnight; those who had lost loved ones still had to come to terms with their grief, a whole generation was affected by their experiences of armed service, and economic impacts, such as rationing, went on for many years afterwards.

One thing which had changed though was that people now had an increased sense of safety. No longer did they have to fear the possibility of the air raid siren going off, or of receiving a telegram with dreadful news. Those daily burdens of anxiety had been lifted, and a new freedom would come from the lifting of many necessary wartime regulations and restrictions. The sense of being constantly anxious for your safety is hugely debilitating, and it is in this, I think, that one of the most powerful messages of the VE Day commemorations is to be found.

We are fortunate to live in a time and place when our collective fear for our safety is relatively low, although we also know how fragile that can be. We do indeed owe a debt of gratitude to those made sacrifices to help establish relationships between nations based on mutual stability and cooperation, rather than aggression. But if we truly recognise what was being celebrated 80 years ago, we realise that our responsibility today is towards those who do not have that sense of safety, whether personally or within their community. If we are so glad to be able to celebrate our own freedom from that burden, we should also be conscious of how much further there is to go until a victory is won which will achieve that for all.
